

TOO / SO

Too and So are used when two subjects in the same sentence are in the same situation, so that ideas are not repeated by the speaker:

John is sick. Cindy is sick.
John is sick and Cindy is too.

Or

John is sick and so is Cindy.

My car works perfectly. My computer works perfectly.

My car works perfectly and my computer does too.

Or

My car works perfectly and so does my computer.

HINT: Be careful with the tenses, remember to use the auxiliars: is, are, was, were, will, did, do, does, can, etc. Depending on the tense you are using.
