SOME and ANY are used for objects and people	some	any	some or any

SOMEONE and ANYONE are used for unspecified (unknown) people - exactly the same as SOMEBODY and ANYBODY	someone	anyone	someone or anyone

### Complete with somebody or anybody / someone or anyone

- 1) Tim bought a gift for \_\_\_\_ at the bookstore. I don't know who the gift was for.
- 2) Jack didn't buy a gift for \_\_\_\_ when he went shopping.
- 3) Shhh! Did you hear something? I think I heard \_\_\_\_ outside!
- 4) I didn't hear \_\_\_\_\_. Are you sure you're not dreaming?
- 5) No, I'm not dreaming! I'm sure I heard \_\_\_\_\_.
- 6) If you are sure you heard \_\_\_\_\_, then maybe we should call the police.

Use:	affirmative sentence	negative sentence	questions
SOMETHING and ANYTHING are used for unspecified (unknown) objects	something	anything	something or anything

### Complete with something or anything

- 1) Peter has \_\_\_\_\_ large in his bookbag. Oh! He got a new dictionary!
- 2) I cleaned out my bookbag yesterday. I don't have \_\_\_\_\_ in it now.
- 3) The doctor said that there might be \_\_\_\_\_ wrong with my arm.
- 4) Really? That's awful! I sure hope there isn't \_\_\_\_\_ wrong.
- 5) Thanks, but I'm worried, because it feels like there is \_\_\_\_\_ under my skin here. It feels like a bump.
- 6) The doctor took an X-ray, but he didn't see \_\_\_\_\_.

## Anybody / Nobody

Use:	affirmative sentence	negative sentence	questions
NOBODY and ANYBODY are used for unspecified people - exactly the same as NO ONE and ANYONE But, "nobody" is used in affirmative sentences, to give a negative idea.	nobody (affirmative sentence, but negative idea)	anybody	anybody somebody

### Complete with nobody and anybody or no one and anyone

- 1) \_\_\_\_\_ knew that Sara was interested in butterflies.
- 2) She didn't tell \_\_\_\_\_ about her interest.
- 3) I wonder if I'll ever meet \_\_\_\_\_ to marry...
- 4) \_\_\_\_\_ stays lonely forever. You'll meet someone.
- 5) I'm just a little bit worried because \_\_\_\_\_ has asked me on a date for a long time.
- 6) When I called my house, \_\_\_\_\_ answered the phone.
- 7) I guess there isn't \_\_\_\_\_ at home.
- 8) We have a piano at my house, but \_\_\_\_\_ knows how to play it!
- 9) Really? There isn't \_\_\_\_\_ who can play?
