

Either ...or / Neither ... nor

Instructions: Combine the sentences so that similar sentences can be joined by "either...or".

Example: Maybe she'll send me a present. On the other hand, maybe she'll make a surprise party for me.

*She'll **either** send me a present **or** make a surprise party for me.*

1. I'm going to order a hot-dog. On the other hand, maybe I'm going to order a burger.
2. I can take a plane. On the other hand I can take a train.
3. Helen will type the letter. On the other hand, maybe Claire will type it.
4. You should go to the branch office on 16th street. On the other hand, maybe you should go to the branch office on 42nd street.
5. It may snow tomorrow. On the other hand, it may rain.
6. She's arriving on the early flight. On the other hand, maybe she's arriving on the late flight.
7. We'll take the bus to work. On the other hand, maybe we'll take a taxi.

Instructions: Combine the sentences so that similar sentences can be joined by "neither...nor".

Example: John didn't go to the meeting. Peter didn't go to the meeting.

***Neither** John **nor** Peter went to the meeting.*

1. The Xerox machine isn't working. The fax machine isn't working.
2. He didn't write to his father. He didn't write to his mother.
3. He doesn't enjoy football. He doesn't enjoy hockey.
4. They didn't approve the new regulations. They didn't approve the new tax reduction.
5. He didn't have his driver's license with him. He didn't have passport with him.
6. She doesn't read magazines. She doesn't read newspapers.
7. He can't sing. He can't dance.
